COVID19 and Feeding the Hungry

LWM, like so many people, organizations, and nations has been greatly challenged by COVID19. We *were* focusing our attention on building toilets for the disabled in Bulawayo, and helping them commence some self–sustainable businesses.

It wasn't long after the pandemic commenced that we realized that **we had to change our priorities**. We had to move from an emphasis on self-sustainable projects to saving the lives of those who are living in places where there is no food, no work and no government help.

We realized that we couldn't help everyone but **we could help some**. We chose to provide aid for the most severely affected in places where we had dependable people on the ground, who have proven themselves as capable and reliable over a number of years.

The Feeding of 700 People

This has resulted in several months of providing food, and some other forms of emergency help, to people in Zimbabwe and Kenya.

Bulawayo—Zimbabwe (300 disabled people)

It is always the most vulnerable people, like those who are disabled, who become most badly effected during crises like this. We chose Bishop Richard Dube and his church to carry out the buying and distribution of food and other essentials. Bishop Dube reports that many of these people would have perished without our support.

Bungoma—Kenya (400 street people)

We decided to support these extremely needy people after Bishop Isaac Wanyama explained that with no restaurants, food stalls, or hotels operating, there not even scraps for these people to eat. Starvation was the obvious outcome.

Since the beginning of the crisis we have been providing one meal a day for these people. The love and care provided by Bishop Wanyama and other pastors has not only saved dozens of lives but captured the attention of the government. Now with the authority of the government, we are able to help reunite many of the young people living on the streets, back to their families and villages.
